Before proceeding with the meeting the Chairman invited all those present to join him silent tribute to two most esteemed members of the Parish who have died since the last meeting namely Professor Reynolds and Mr (Teddy) Black.

The Chairman asked permission to record a special minute noting Mr Blacks service to the Community. He was Chairman of the Institute committee for 25 years and first recorded as a member in 1945. He was also Chairman of the Sheepdog Trials Committee and was a member of other committees.

On a happier note it gave him much pleasure in recording the birth of Elizabeth Jane Hayton on June 5th 1990.

1.Minutes of the Last annual general meeting were read and having been accepted as a true record of that meeting, were duly signed. Proposed Mrs Brownlow and Seconded by Mr Williams.

2.Election of Officers. There being no other nominations, the Chairman and vice Chairman offered themselves for re-election. Mr K Dawson proposed, Seconded by Mrs Hayton and they were together unanimously elected to serve in their respective offices for another year.

3.Matters Arising.

The Garburn sign in keeping with five others, has been erected.

The new bridge at Kentmere hall is still a low priority but will continue to be progressed.

The Foot bridge has had temporary and effective repairs. A replacement has been ordered by the Park authority.

4. Audited accounts.

The SLDC grant attracted to itself interest which will be paid into the Institute accounts after the next bill is settled.

The meeting agreed that the balance at Bank was satisfactory, and approved the action of the Chairman in not applying for a precept for the year 91/92.

The Chairman stated that he had asked for a quote for a Parish Meeting notice board for official notices, to stop the use of the Institute windows which during weekends in winter and most days of the season are masked by vehicles. This action was approved.

The chairman's expenses in respect of year ending 90 and year ending 91 are approx. £17 00, and will be reflected in the current accounts.

5. Car Parking

In announcing that Car Parking had been raised as a special agenda item because of a recent development, the Chairman made the point that he had achieved a unique if somewhat unenviable position of not only becoming the first Parishioner but also the first Parish Chairman to be fined for parking in Kentmere. He read the appropriate correspondence pointing out that the result was unsatisfactory, in that members of the Parish had forfeited a parking place previously agreed with the Police.

The Chairman had told him of his (PC Cowans) responsibility in the matter and that he did not approve of the action which he would bring to the attention of the Parish Meeting.

He told them that a meeting had been organised with available, the Councillors concerned, the Safety Officer and the Highways dept officer together with himself and the Vice chairman.

Conversation covered well discussed matters concerning the use of land for car parks and the need for deterrence on the basis of "the full theatre" principal.

It was agreed that the Vice Chairman should receive comments on the possible need for yellow lines, single or double, with or without discretionary signing. He would note the views of the two areas of Greenquarter, Hallow Bank and add them to the present comments already in the possession of the Highway authority.

The comment was made and appreciated that yellow lines tended to control at the point, but also pressed the traffic on to further areas where congestion could occur.

The 'twenty eight day' rule was discussed in relation to Mrs Black's Car Park but as it was a national ruling it was thought that no extension request would be likely to succeed.

There being no other business The Chairman closed the meeting at 9.27 pm to allow for a statement to be made on the Television scheme. He convened an extraordinary meeting of the Television committee to hear the statement.
