Minutes of the Meeting held on 9<sup>th</sup> December 2002

Matters Arising from the Minutes

Summer Dance

Tickets were available. There was to be dancing to "Jump the Gun".

Parking at the Institute

This proposed scheme had become involved with the disputed footpath up Cappelrigg drive. Negotiations were still continuing with CCC and Capita. Iain Johnston & N Pighills put painted markings on the road to indicate the line of the proposed changes.

Roads and Verges

Mr A Williams reported on the progress made in recent months and there was general discussion about the road condition.

Farm Plastic Waste

It was agreed that N. Pighills would arrange a suitable date and that C. Black would try to involve more farmers for the collection at Millrigg to help to reduce the cost.

Kentmere Pound

It was agreed that we should seek a price for completing the restoration work and then look for grant assistance. N Pighills was to obtain a layout design and a price for a sign to be attached to the gate.

Traffic Count

The CCC's promised traffic count had not been carried – out. I. Johnston and H. Fry volunteered to carry – out a count themselves since they were more accurate than a mere machine.

T.V. Scheme

David and Judith Bridge gave a report. Accounts were circulated. Annual contribution was to be 20. It was agreed that a healthy bank balance should be maintained in case of a serious breakdown or the need for renewal of equipment.
